DONNA HANSON November 25, 1942 – November 30, 2017

Donna L. Hanson (née Larsen), age 75, of Des Plaines, passed away on November 30, 2017. She was the beloved wife of

David for 52 years, loving mother of Daniel (Carrie) Darryl and Derek, proud grandmother of Jakob and Emma and dear sister of Kenneth (Vickie) Larsen and Glenn (Jeanne) Larsen.



Donna Lillian Larsen was born in Plentywood, Montana. Her early years were spent in Westby, Montana, where her father, the Rev. Harold E. Larsen, served at Emmaus Lutheran Church. Two years later, they moved to Plainview, Nebraska, where she started her formal education in a one-room country school.

After Donna graduated from Green Bay West High School in 1961, she worked as a receptionist in a doctors' clinic. It was at the church where she met her future husband, David Hanson. They were married June 12, 1965.

In 1967, they moved to the Chicago area to accept a job offer. Donna then worked as a typist until their first son, Daniel, was born in 1969, followed by son Darryl in 1973 and son Derek in 1979.

She volunteered at the Tree House Animal shelter for many years and made friends with many of the felines. She always enjoyed spending time with the cats.

Donna sang in the church choir for many years, but had to quit when she lost her voice and never got it back well enough to sing again. She did continue to play piano for events and services.

As the result of a request from a friend, she started playing the piano for the Lutheran General Older Adult Care, gradually adding other nursing homes until she was going to two or three every week for many years. She also played piano for services at the Methodist Campground in summer.

She had a passion for collecting cat related things: figurines, pictures, pillows, clothes, jewelry, anything with a cat on it, and had collected hundreds of items. She was also "Cat Mother" to multiple cats. The most recent loss was Ditto, who passed Oct. 25 at age 20.

Donna suffered through many medical ailments, including asthma, osteoporosis, peripheral neuropathy, etc., and was diagnosed with multiple myeloma in September 2015. Her last challenge started on Oct. 12, when she experienced double vision while driving to her doctor for chemo.

We continue to give one \$10 Jewel card to each guest (until we run out) and this card is very much appreciated. Donations are always welcome.

I'll share with you that this past Monday an anonymous donor wrapped \$5 Jewel cards and included a Christmas card. Many of the guests were quite touched and read their card out loud. This is another example of how this Ministry touches folks. That might be the only card that was received this season. What a nice way to spread the joy of Christmas!

Again, thank you for your support of our Assistance Ministry outreach. We find that our guests enjoy chatting with us and sharing their stories with us. The need to help this community is great.

EPIPHANY

The **Epiphany season** is a liturgical period following the Christmas season. Many Protestant churches celebrate an Epiphany season that lasts until the day before Ash Wednesday, which marks the beginning of the season of Lent.

The ELCA celebrates the revelation of Christ to all nations as represented by the magi who came to worship Jesus on January 6th, the day of Epiphany. The church calendar recognizes the season of Epiphany from Jan. 6 until the last Sunday before Ash Wednesday which is celebrated as the Transfiguration of Our Lord.

Among the principal themes are: the revelation of Christ to all nations, Jesus' baptism in the River Jordan, and Christ as the light of the world. The colors of the season are white and green. White is the color associated with the

festivals of Christ and suggests gladness, joy and light for the day of Epiphany. White is used the first week after Epiphany when the baptism of our Lord is celebrated and the last week of the season of Epiphany when the Transfiguration of our Lord is celebrated.

The color green, reminiscent of living things, suggests spiritual growth. It is used during the heart of the Epiphany season between the day of Epiphany and Transfiguration."






